


Indiana Department of Transportation: Summary & Analysis

Indiana's population has seen much slower growth than the majority of other states across the country, ranking 32nd with only a modest 2 percent increase between 2010-2015. Indianapolis constituted 78 percent of Indiana's net growth in 2015 and at almost two million people, it represents 30 percent of the state's total population. The total proposed transportation budget presented in the Indiana DOT Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) 2016-2019 was approximately \$7B, consisting of ~\$3.7B in federal funding, ~\$3B in state funding, and \$215M in local and municipal funding.

The table on the left below highlights the year to date bidding activity on Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) projects. The average project size for 2016 YTD is \$4.1M, with fewer than 10 projects over \$10M in total project value. Only five contractors won jobs over \$10M, Walsh at \$21.7M, Dave Omara at \$12.1M, E&B Paving at \$11.2, Milestone at \$10.9M, and Vimas Painting at \$10.8M. The most active contractor so far in 2016 has been E&B Paving, winning 47 projects worth just over \$87M, while entering 137 total bids. Reith Riley Construction followed in second, winning 27 projects over \$75M in value, while bidding on a total of 121 projects. The table on the right below highlights the competition between bidders on these projects showing the average margin of victory by month, with the most competitive month being November with an average margin of victory of 9.7%.



The graph to the right shows the INDOT 2016-2019 Capital Budget broken down by year and funding source. Federal funds contribute to the highest percentage of total funds per year, averaging \$935M per year, with state funds slightly lower at an average of \$759M per year, and local highway funds at a minimal amount with an average of \$54M per year. The most proportionate year allocated for state vs federal funds is in 2016. Also worth noting is that state funds allocated decrease substantially from 2016 to 2019, or from \$926M to \$625M.

The graph on the left shows the total number of bidders for all INDOT projects from January 2016 through November 2016. The median number of bidders on 2016 projects YTD is 3. The majority of projects had 2 - 4 bidders. There were just 28 projects (9%) that had only 1 bidder, and 42 with five or more (14%).

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In the first list below, we have highlighted the top 10 Counties by expected total project value from 2017-2019. A large number of sizable projects are located in counties with the state's most populated cities. The leading county for expected total project value is Marion County, where Indianapolis, the most populous city and State Capital, is located. The second largest city, Fort Wayne, is located in the county expected to hold for the fourth highest project value from '17-'19.

Additionally, in the second list below, we have highlighted a number of large projects (\$7MM+) that INDOT has identified in their Fiscal Year 2017 – 2019 Project Forecast.


